

NOTEBOOKS: Your notebook will be collected and graded several times during the semester or completion of a notebook quiz. Each check is worth 25 points.

Calculation of Grades


Your participation grade will be factored in during progress report times, mid-term, and FINAL grade.

SDHS Cell Phone and Electronic Use Policy
